Meeting Minutes

The ALA July 19th 2004 meeting was held at the Hawthorn of Aurora Clubhouse. An executive session was held from 7:00 to 8:00 PM. All items discussed in the executive session were discussed in the open meeting>

The general meeting was called to order at 8:00 PM.

Secretary Report:

Milano read the June 21st meeting minutes. Love asked that electronic copies be sent to Andrew@e-dineronline.com. Hogan motion to approve the minutes and the motion was seconded by Donoho. The motion carried.

Treasurers Report:

No report.

The meeting adjourned to General Discussion at 8:03 PM. Meet was called back to order at 8:10 PM.

Old Business:

- 1) Dave reported that the west shoreline buoys were measured at 130' from shore. The buoys were moved out to ~230' in attempt to minimize wave action on adjacent shorelines. Dave spoke with Mr. Conway of ASHA who stated that he believe this helped reduce wave impact to his property.
- 2) Six Buoys were installed and two more are to be installed on the west shoreline. Joe Chambers is to have anchors made. Two more buoys will be placed at the north point by the slalom course.
- 3) Pat McCarthy reported Fecal coliform counts remain high at the east inlet and at the pump station. Pat reported that he also began testing for E. coli and these values track accordingly with the Fecal coliform. See attached #1.

Donoho and Chambers will find information on die bottles used to trace sewer lines.

Milano suggested getting signs made that state "High Bacterial Levels, No fishing, No Skiing, No Swimming in the Ski Zone". Milano made motion to

purchase signs and post them on buoys adjacent to the ski zone, both boat ramps, and on Aurora Lake Road. Hogan seconded the motion and it carried. Joe Chambers to drive sign posts in on Aurora Lake Road and Milano and McCarthy to post signs.

Milano made the motion to have the slalom course removed. Love seconded the motion and it carried. Love to notify course users to have the course removed.

- 4) Lake Patrol: Aurora and Reminderville continue to patrol.
- 5) Lake rules: Lake rules have been submitted to Alan Shore. He stated he should have a response by the end of August.

New Business:

- 1) Donoho brought up the concept of concealed weapons on vessel on Aurora Lake. Milano stated that there is Ohio law that prohibits weapons on boats, however Hogan is to verify.
